

ourse Description:

This course is an introduction to a broad range of painting, sculpture and architecture in Florence, Italy. Beginning with the great projects of the Middle Ages that defined the religious and political centers of the city, attention will focus on major monuments and masterpieces of the Renaissance period.

While we will look at the works in terms of their aesthetic and stylistic qualities, we will also pay special attention to issues of social, political and economic context, as well as to function, which was integral to the artistic production of the period.

Where possible, we will look at the primary sources, in order to understand and experience the works as their original viewers did and as their creators intended. By looking at the works of art from such multiple vintage points, we will come to a richer understanding of the Renaissance Art in Florence, its artists and patrons.



Over ten entertaining, information-packed, one-hour sessions, we will **start with Giotto and end with great Michelangelo.** Everything you ever wanted to know about the Renaissance!

Course organization: 10 one hour sessions~45 min lecture followed by 15 min discussion/Q&A

A Renaissance Art Historian and Culture Management expert, with deeply-rooted experience in international arts projects and fundraising for culture in Italy, Paola Vojnovic is also a curator, published author and research scholar as well as a sought-after private tour guide for Florence and Tuscany. Paola is an acclaimed specialized guide for the City of Florence and has the privilege to meet in Florence people from all walks of life in addition to the powerful influencers from the world of entertainment, media and politics.

In addition to creating custom tours for individuals and families, Paola also designs cultural programs for specialized small groups, and acts as a liaison between museums and clients to provide special behind-the-scenes access and thus ensuring unforgettable, once-in-a-lifetime experiences for visitors to Italy.

Paola Vojnovic earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in art history from Arizona State University (1999), her Master of Arts degree in Renaissance Art History from Syracuse University, New York (2008), and her second Master's degree in Preservation and Management of Archaeological, Historical and Artistic Heritage from the Università di Siena, Italy (2010). She held internships at the Peggy Guggenheim Museum in Venice (2000), the Pitti Palace/Galleria d'arte Moderna in Florence (2007), and for UNESCO in Serbia (2010).

Prior to pursuing her graduate degrees in art history, Paola owned and managed WIP Art Gallery in Scottsdale, Arizona (2001-2005).
